EPA Cites Company in Georgia



The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has issued an Administrative Order requiring a company in Georgia to clean up its act. The EPA cited [Kings Mountain Landing, Inc.](#) for alleged violations related to storm water management at Kings Mountain Landing subdivision in Lake Hartwell, Georgia.

The EPA is ordering Kings Mountain Landing, Inc. to properly design, install and maintain best management practices, monitor turbidity, conduct adequate self-inspections and stop discharging off-site sediment into an unnamed tributary to Lake Hartwell.

Include Utility Work Provisions in Your SWPPP

A Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) should, of course, be created before land on any construction site is disturbed. If utility work is going to take place during construction, stipulations regarding it should be incorporated into the SWPPP. Things to include:

- Identify who is responsible for installing and maintaining erosion and sediment control devices.
- Outline the erosion and sediment control measures that will be utilized by all parties doing work on the site.
- If different parties will be responsible for erosion and sediment control protection at different times on the worksite, include timelines and ensure that no areas of the worksite will go unprotected at any time.

In addition to making these specifications in your SWPPP, it's critical that agreements encompassing all of the above be drawn up and signed between the developer and all relevant utility companies. This, combined with using [regulation-compliant erosion and sediment control products](#), should help ensure that profits stay in your pocket, and don't get spent on costly fines.
